Did You Know About These Free Drop-off Options?

- **Appliances:** including fridges, freezers, washers, dryers, coffee makers, and hair dryers
- **Electronics:** including TVs, monitors, computers, laptops, stereo equipment, cables, keyboards, phones, chargers and gaming peripherals
- **Scrap metal:** including bicycles, barbeques, metal siding, wire fencing, empty paint cans, and hot water tanks
- **Outdoor power equipment:** including pressure washers, lawn mowers, and chain saws
- **Lighting products:** including fixtures, lamps, Christmas lights, fluorescent tubes and compacts, LEDs, and incandescent light bulbs
- **Textiles:** clean & dry textiles including: accessories and bags, clothing (all types, reusable or not), curtains, general household textiles (towels, blankets, sheets), shoes and boots, sleeping bags
- **Used motor oil,** filters, gasoline, and antifreeze
- **Used cooking oil** (vegetable-based)
- **Household batteries:** both regular and rechargeable

Determining Your Collection Route

Note the colour and letter assigned to your location on the map (page 2) and match them to the monthly schedules.

Set out compost and recyclables on any day that matches your colour (weekly), and set out garbage and glass on any day that matches both your colour & letter (bi-weekly).



Curbside Collection Map




To determine your collection schedule, find your colour and letter on the map below.
Your colour tells you on what days your compost and mixed recyclables are collected (weekly).
Your letter signals when your garbage and glass are picked up (every second week).
Light Green area represents optional curbside collection. Register at mission.ca



Collection Rules

Avoid attracting wildlife, only set out materials between 5:00 am and 8:00 am on collection day. The fine for early setouts is \$250.

No bag, bin or bundle may weigh more than 20 kg each.

	<p>Garbage</p> <p>Limited to two 80-L bins weighing up to 20 kg each. Oversized & over-weight bins will not be collected. Do not use a bin that could be mistaken as a recycling bin.</p> <p>BI-WEEKLY collection.</p>	<p>Bi-weekly garbage collection, on average, has reduced the amount of garbage collected by 100 tonnes per month. In direct relation, the amount of compost collected has increased by 100 tonnes a month.</p> <p>Burying compostable materials in a landfill results in methane gas production, which is a strong greenhouse gas. Thank you for sorting!</p>
	<p>Recyclables</p> <p>Mixed recyclables: WEEKLY collection in Blue Bins.</p> <p>Glass bottles & jars: BI-WEEKLY collection in Black Box on garbage day.</p>	<p>Extra recyclables can be set out in lidded bins, not exceeding 121 litres in capacity, with D-handles and a blue sticker. Blue stickers are available free of charge at City Hall, Welton Common and the Leisure Centre.</p> <p>Black Boxes and Blue Bins are available at Welton Common, 7337 Welton Street. Fees may apply.</p> <p>BAGGED RECYCLING IS NOT ACCEPTED. ALL MATERIAL MUST BE PLACED IN BINS LOOSE (EXCEPT SHREDDED PAPER – place in paper bag or cardboard box.).</p>



Compostables

All compostables can be set out in lidded 80-L bins with an orange sticker.

Orange stickers are available at Welton Common free of charge.

Store all waste inside or secured until 5:00 am on collection day. The fine for early setouts is \$250. No bag, bin or bundle may weigh more than 20 kg each.

ACCEPTED ITEMS AND PREPARATION

Yard Waste



Collected in 80-L bins with an orange sticker, paper yard waste bags or **compostable** plastic bags. Limited to 10 extra yard waste bins, bags, or bundles per collection day.

- leaves, moss & weeds
- grass clippings, twigs & plant trimmings
- branches up to 5 cm in diameter and 90 cm in length

Small branches may be bundled using natural string (jute, twine etc.), rather than included in a bag or bin.

Food Waste



Collected in unlimited amounts.

- fruit/vegetable wastes & leftovers
- cooked, baked & processed goods
- bones, cheese, meat & bread
- coffee grounds, paper filters & tea bags

All food waste must be contained in a bin with a tight-fitting lid, such as a 46-litre Rot Pot.

Food Contaminated Paper



Collected in unlimited amounts.

- pizza boxes
- donut boxes
- paper food napkins
- facial tissues
- wet newspaper

Contaminated paper is not recyclable but can be composted. Please include food-contaminated paper in your Rot Pot.

PLEASE NOTE

If using bags, ensure they are paper or **compostable** plastic. Look for one of these two symbols on **compostable** plastic bags:



Leave grass clippings on the lawn to return nutrients to the soil.

No plastics, metal or glass, please. Bins do not have to be lined. Place crumpled newspaper at the bottom of the bin to soak up liquids.

If using a plastic liner, ensure it is certified **compostable**. See above for the appropriate symbols.

Keep food waste in a secure enclosure until collection day to keep bears and other wildlife away.

Contaminated paper, yard and food waste can be set out in the same container. To control potential odours, layer food waste with dry leaves or small twigs.

Compost containing any amount of food waste must be contained in a bin with a tight-fitting lid, such as your Rot Pot, and stored inside.

Household Hazardous Waste

Drop Off Anytime, Free of Charge

The Mission Recycling Depot accepts many household hazardous items and substances any day of the year. They include:

Residential Paint

Includes paint aerosols, paint cans, paint tubs and paint products, such as latex, oil, varnish, wood finishing oil, shellac, marine paint and wood preservatives.

Domestic Pesticides

Includes liquid, solid and aerosol pesticides in containers up to 10 litres in size. Labels must display skull and crossbones, the word “domestic”, and the Pest Control Product (PCP) number.

Flammables

Includes aerosols and liquids, such as paint thinner, fondue fuel, and acetone in quantities of up to 10 litres. Gasoline and kerosene must be dropped off in an ULC-approved container not exceeding 25 litres in volume.

Snow Time

Clear Sidewalks

Residents are responsible for keeping sidewalks in front of their homes free of snow and ice. Please ensure safe passage for everyone, including elderly people and people with mobility issues, to avoid liabilities. If you have a neighbour who cannot clear the sidewalk, consider offering help.

Keep Drains Free

Snow and ice accumulations can block street drains. Do not deposit snow near grates, but clear snow from grates to prevent road flooding.

Be Patient

Curbside Collection

It is not safe to manoeuvre large collection vehicles down slippery and narrowed roadways. If your collection is missed due to bad weather, please be patient and check the City's website (mission.ca/curbside), or call the curbside collection contractor at **604-820-6487** for updates.

Road Clearing Efforts

During snowfall events, City crews work around the clock to clear snow and ice from roads on a priority basis. Please note that roads are not cleared to bare pavement. Check the City's website or call Public Works at **604-820-3761** for updates.

Going to the Depot?

Here's How to Enhance the Experience

- **Make your trip worthwhile.** Adding to traffic and lineups to drop off one spent toaster and a light bulb is not a good idea.
- **Sort your load at home.** Sorting recyclables at the counter takes time and holds up other depot customers.
- **Follow depot staff's direction,** they are there to keep things running and safe.
- **Direct program-related questions to the City** (engineering@mission.ca or 604-820-3736).

Sorting Recyclables for Drop-off

Sort your clean, dry, everyday recyclables into the following categories at home:

- **Paper products** (newspaper, flyers, magazines, office paper, envelopes & cardboard)
- **Rigid retail containers** (soup & pet food cans, metal lids, plastic cups, tubs, pails & jugs, plastic clam shells, tin takeout trays)
- **Retail container glass** (jam & pickle jars, marinade & ketchup bottles)
- **Styrofoam™** (trays & boards, sorted into white and coloured) – no flexible foam or “peanuts”
- **Flexible plastic packaging** (chip & dry pasta bags, pet food bags, candy wrappers, produce netting, Ziploc™ bags, and Saran™ wrap, shopping & bread bags, case lot overwrap)

Wild Things

Keep Your Waste Secure

It's a fact: household waste attracts wildlife.

The City's Solid Waste Management Bylaw 5526-2015 requires that garbage, recyclables and compost only be set out for curbside collection between 5:00 am and 8:00 am.

The fine for early setouts is \$250 per day.

Other than for curbside collection, garbage, recyclables and compost must be stored in a manner that prevents access by dangerous wildlife, preferably in a garage, shed, or other secure enclosure.

Protect Yourself

Bears are also attracted to small livestock, beehives, bird feeders, pet food, barbecues, and ripe fruit. Please be advised that backyard hens must be secured with electric fencing as per the Zoning Bylaw 5949-2020.

Bears that become accustomed to human food sources are more likely to become a public safety risk which may result in their destruction.

Wildlife Act

Wildlife is regulated by the provincial *Wildlife Act*. Feeding or attracting bears is an offence under the act. Bears that become habituated to human food sources are generally trapped and destroyed, not relocated.

To report an aggressive wildlife encounter, please phone the provincial Conservation Officer Service at 1-877-952-7277.

The WildSafeBC Program was established by the British Columbia Conservation Foundation to prevent conflict with wildlife through collaboration, education and community solutions. Numerous food-conditioned bears are destroyed in British Columbia every year.

Water Conservation

Water is a Precious Commodity

We owe it to ourselves to use this resource wisely and to minimize waste. Due to high peak water demands in the summer, water restrictions are implemented each year. Watering restrictions will ensure that Mission residents continue to have a high quality water supply capable of supporting a growing population.

Water Restrictions in effect May 1 – September 30 with potential for extension depending on drought levels. Check ourwatermatters.ca for up-to-date information.

Due to high peak water demands in the summer, the Abbotsford/Mission Water Sewer Commission implements water restrictions each year. Watering restrictions will ensure that Abbotsford and Mission residents continue to have a high quality water supply capable of supporting a growing population.

Did You Know?

Abbotsford and Mission have a Landscape & Irrigation Waterwise Efficiency program. This program offers free irrigation and landscape assessments to Abbotsford and Mission residents. During this session, you will learn how to make your landscape more water efficient, how to amend your soil and get recommendations for making your irrigation system more efficient. If you amend your soil, plant waterwise plants, or install a climate-based irrigation controller, you will be eligible to apply for up to \$250 in rebates. Conserving Water

Inside:

- Install high-efficiency shower heads, toilets and tap aerators
- Fix leaky pipes, hoses, faucets and toilets
- Take shorter showers
- Run only full loads in your dishwasher & washing machine

- Choose native and drought-resistant plants
- Sweep driveways and sidewalks instead of using a hose, and use a bucket when washing your car
- Apply mulch and use soaker hoses to reduce evaporation
- Leave grass clippings on your lawn

Spring Cleanup 2025



Spring Clean-up starts early this year. Curbside collection **residents may set out up to two cubic metres of additional garbage or bulky items on their regular garbage collection day only**. One cubic metre is equivalent to six bags of garbage or the size of one stove. Mattresses must be bagged. Bags can be collected free of charge from Welton Common, the Leisure Centre, Public Works and City Hall.

Items set out at the curb must not be loose and must be manageable by two people. Excess or unacceptable materials will be left at the curb, and prompt cleanup of “leftovers” remains the resident’s responsibility. Fines apply.

Materials EXCLUDED from Spring Cleanup Collection:

- **Electronics:** e.g. computers, monitors, audio equipment, etc.
- **Renovation waste:** e.g. flooring, windows, lumber, drywall, sinks, toilets, etc.
- **Hazardous materials:** e.g. paint, solvents, pesticides, sharps, fluorescent lights, etc.
- **Vehicle parts:** e.g. tires, batteries, motor oil, antifreeze, etc.

Land Clearing Management Program

The City recently updated and created Development Permit Areas for the protection of the natural environment.


Development Permits may be required for land alterations or clearing in regulated areas as identified on Map 14A and 14B of the Official Community Plan. The purpose of this initiative is to equip the City with the proper tools to regulate otherwise uncontrolled land clearing which may occur outside or in advance of the development process.

Unless subject to an exemption, a Development Permit is required for any clearing of virgin or regenerated forest which exceeds the following cumulative areas in a calendar year:

- 200 m² within the Urban Growth Boundary
- 500 m² outside the Urban Growth Boundary

This program also regulates development near streams in accordance with the provincial Riparian Areas Protection Regulation. Generally, any new development or disturbance within 30 m from the natural boundary of a stream would require a Development Permit.



Knotweed is Highly Invasive

Knotweed (Japanese, Himalayan, giant and bohemian) is not a health hazard, but it is highly invasive and can **grow through asphalt and concrete, including building foundations**. Its root system can extend up to 15 metres laterally and 3 metres into the ground. Knotweed, due to its segmented stem, is often mistaken for bamboo.

Conventional control methods such as physically pulling plants is ineffective due to the extensive root network. Mowing is strongly discouraged as it will cause the infestation to spread and it is likely to stimulate further growth of existing plants.

Recycling Contamination:

What Is It and How Can We Prevent It?

Contamination in curbside blue bins is a major obstacle in the recycling process. After collection, materials are brought to a receiving facility where they are further sorted into categories i.e., paper, plastic, tin, etc. From there, the materials are baled and sold to end markets.

When contaminated material is found, it impacts its end use. High contamination rates could mean recycling is no longer a viable option, and the material is directed to the landfill.

Keeping contamination rates low keeps program costs down. Mission's curbside recycling currently has high levels of contamination which could result in fines and eventually increased collection fees. We need your help to reduce contamination.

The most common contaminants in curbside recycling are:


- Material that is not residential packaging or paper i.e., toys, plastic totes, plastic products.
- Material that is not part of our accepted material list i.e., hard, and soft cover books, packaging with mixed layers of paper and plastic.
- Hazardous material, including batteries, propane or butane cylinders, needles, lighters.
- Textiles i.e., clothing, footwear, linens.
- Garbage.
- Soiled paper products. i.e. paper towel, napkins, etc.

Only Rain In Your Drain

Even Clean Tap Water Can Pollute Fish Habitat

Unlike water that goes down your household drain, water that flows into storm drains is not treated or filtered, and all storm drains eventually lead to creeks, rivers, or lakes. As per Mission's Sewer Bylaw 5033-2009 it is illegal to discharge into a storm drain or ditch wastes such as cleaning detergents (including biodegradable products), oil, anti-freeze, gasoline, car-washing soaps and products, chlorinated water, paint, varnishes and stripper products or residues, concrete and grout product and wash water, pesticides and other household poisons.

Many municipal water supply disinfection systems include chlorine and ammonia together which produces chloramine, which is very toxic to aquatic organisms. It is therefore important to never introduce wash water from vehicles or driveways into storm drains, and even straight tap water should not be allowed to flow into storm sewer intakes.

Follow these tips to keep materials hazardous to the environment out of our stormwater systems and out of our waterways:

- Never use bleach when cleaning concrete or asphalt surfaces, such as driveways. Direct runoff to a porous surface, such as gravel or grass.
- Clean paint brushes and rollers inside your home, so that the wash water will go to the sanitary sewer, rather than the storm sewer.
- Visit a commercial car wash for cleaning your vehicle. Wash water from these operations is directed to the sanitary sewer and receives treatment. If you must wash your vehicle at home do so on a grass or gravel area so that wash water can infiltrate into the ground.


Climate Change and Mission's Environmental Charter

Holiday Schedule

Mission Landfill & Recycling Depot

Both the **Mission Landfill and the Recycling Depot will be closed** on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day and will close at 3 pm on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

Curbside Collection

Please note any changes to curbside collection due to Christmas, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, as indicated in the calendar. Residents can put out twice the regular amount of garbage on their garbage collection day immediately following the holidays. Additional garbage is acceptable in bags or bins. Waste can only be set out between 5:00 am and 8:00 am on the morning of collection day.

Holiday Waste Reduction Tips

- Avoid elaborate gift packaging.
- Use reusable gift bags, or make the wrapper part of the gift (e.g., use a tea towel).
- Bake cookies, make preserves, or create your own beverage concoction.
- Use leftover food to make soup, or send leftovers home with your guests.
- Give the gift of time, such as offering shopping, cleaning, baby or pet-sitting services.

Christmas Tree-cycling

At the Curb:

Christmas trees will be collected at the curb on your regular collection day, but **must be free of decorations and cut in half** to fit into the collection vehicle.

At the Landfill:

One Christmas tree per household may also be dropped off at the Mission Landfill free of charge anytime. The Mission Landfill is located at 32000 Dewdney Trunk Road, just east of the Stave Lake Dam, and is open seven days a week, from 8 am to 5 pm, but closed on statutory holidays, including Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.
