

## **USE RADIO TO CALL FOR FIRST AID**

At this facility, first aid is summoned via radio instead of calling 1111. There are three designated Occupational First Aid Attendants (OFAAs) on site. These staff, along with facility operations and maintenance personnel, carry radios and respond to first aid calls. In a serious or life-threatening emergency, call 911 Immediately, then notify an OFAA by radio or through a staff member with a radio.

### WHO HAS A RADIO?

You can call for first aid through:

- Front Desk Staff
- Fitness Staff
- Lifeguards
- Supervisors (some offices also have radios)

# WHEN REQUESTING FIRST AID VIA RADIO, SAY:

- Your name
- Your location
- Number of injured person(s)
- Name(s) (if known)
- Nature of injury
- Whether the person is conscious or unconscious

Remain calm, speak clearly, and repeat key details if needed.

# **WORKING IN OTHER AREAS OR REMOTE LOCATIONS?**

Ensure you complete a site-specific safety orientation including:

- How to summon first aid
- Where the nearest first aid kit/station is
- Who the OFAA is and how to contact them

First aid must be accessible within 10 minutes of all workers.
