Pleasant View Housing Society: A New Housing Opportunity in Mission – Update

We would like to update you on the opening date for the new mental health campus of care to be operated by Pleasant View Housing Society in the community of Mission.

The completion of this project was scheduled for early 2015; however renovations to the existing facility are now scheduled for completion at the end of March 2015, with a phased move-in anticipated between June 1st and 26th, 2015.

Pleasant View will provide Mental Health Residential and Housing services to residents of Mission. Working closely with Fraser Health, Pleasant View has developed a model of care which will support a diverse range of needs with an intensive focus on rehabilitation and recovery. There will be 19 residential care beds, 22 assisted living beds and 13 independent living bachelor suites, which will include support services.

Questions and Answers:

How will this change impact the residents transitioning to Pleasant View?

The residents who are living at Katalin Home, Meadowview Manor and Mission Hills Manor, who have a transition plan to Pleasant View, will remain in their current locations until Pleasant View renovations finalise and the phased transitions commence in June. We are grateful to the owners of these three resources, who will continue to work closely with the clinical team, residents and families during this transition period with a view to ensuring a seamless transition of care to the new resource.

How will residents and their families be informed of this change?

It is important that residents and their families are informed of this change in a respectful and planned manner. Residents will be informed by Fraser Health staff on January 23rd.

Will this create new jobs for Mission?

Pleasant View is currently hiring new staff.
