

More Recyclables Drop-off Options

Recyclables not accepted at the Mission Landfill can be dropped off at the Mission Recycling Depot free of charge.

- Electronics (TVs, computers, monitors, audio equipment, peripherals, scanners etc.). Details: return-it.ca
- Electrical equipment (toasters, lamps etc.) Details: electrocycle.ca
- Household batteries, cell phones & chargers. Details: call2recycle.ca.
- All light bulbs (including fluorescents & LEDs). Details: regeneration.ca.
- Smoke & carbon monoxide detectors. Details: regeneration.ca.
- Vegetable-based cooking oil
- Used motor oil, oil filters and containers. Details: bcusedoil.com.
- Household hazardous products (paint, spray paint, paint thinner, gasoline & kerosene, domestic pesticides). Details: regeneration.ca.

Safety & Usage Requirements

- Please prepare old (pre-1990) drywall and other, potentially asbestos-containing material, as per the instructions in this pamphlet, before arriving at the landfill.
- Please secure your load to reduce litter on landfill access roads. A \$10 surcharge applies to unsecured loads.



- Please have Mission identification ready or resident sticker visible before going across the scale.
- Please comply with instructions you may receive from landfill staff.
- Do not smoke anywhere on the premises.
- Please keep children and pets inside the vehicle.
- Look out for traffic and heavy equipment and watch your step around drop-off bins.

Please Sort Your Load

Not everything accepted at Minnie's Pit is actually disposed of, and some materials are accepted free of charge. **Please plan ahead and separate recyclable materials** when loading your vehicle.

The following materials must be separated out for recycling:

- Clean, residential retail packaging & printed paper. Please separate into:
 - * paper & cardboard products
 - * plastic & metal container packaging
 - * container glass
 - * stretchy plastic film (e.g. bread bags)
- Scrap metal, including appliances and propane tanks
- Brush and branches
- Grass, leaves, moss & food waste
- Dimensional wood (clean & treated)
- Gypsum board and ACM (please see detail on reverse)
- Asphalt shingles
- Soil, sod, bricks and small (< 30 cm in size) concrete debris
- Passenger car & light truck tires (off-rim: free; on-rim: \$1/tire)
- Automotive batteries **Free!**

Surcharges Apply to Unsorted Loads

Loads containing more than 5% recyclables will be surcharged 50% on the higher tipping fee for the entire load.

Preparing Drywall & Asbestos

Residential drywall only. Old (pre-1990) drywall and other potentially asbestos-containing material (ACM) is only accepted, if it is double-bagged in clear, factory-labelled, 6-mil plastic drywall bags.



Bags should be tied "goose-neck" style, and tied and sealed before arriving at the landfill. Detailed instructions are available at the scalehouse and at mission.ca.

Before you start, please visit the Worksafe website at www.worksafebc.com and search for "asbestos" to learn about risks and safety precautions.

Drywall and potential ACM does not have to be double-bagged in clear, labelled, 6-mil drywall bags, if:

- it post-dates 1990, or
- recent test results confirm the absence

Residential Asbestos	\$168.00/t

Minimum charge for non-residents: \$10/load
